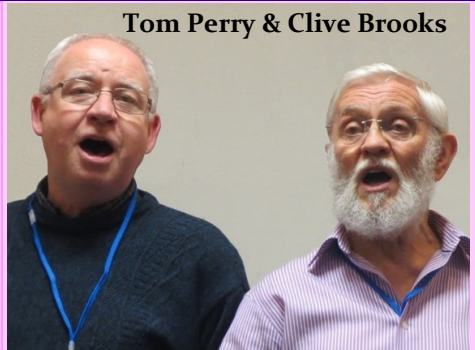
## Saturday 10:30—11:45 *Little Folk : Ugly Bug Ball*

Willie lived in Edgworth for about 40 years before moving to Bolton to become a writer of dialect prose and poetry. Although not widely known now, he was popular at the time and deserves wider recognition. Much of his work was humorous and several poems were put to music and broadcast on the radio in the 1940s and 50s.

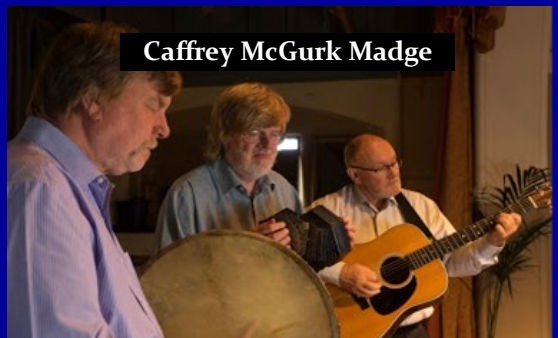

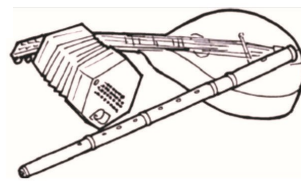
